

Mor successfully completes projects

A FALMOUTH design company, which was the creative force behind two landmark Cornish projects, is celebrating after both reached successful completion.

Mor, based in the former St John Ambulance building in the town, was instrumental in the design and construction of the recently opened Penhaligon Star, as well as the resting places on the recently extended Camel Trail.

The Penhaligon Star, which is sited at Pencalenick School in Truro, was created in memory of the late Truro and St Austell MP, David Penhaligon.

Inspired by a poem from Romeo and Juliet, which was written on a wreath at Mr Penhaligon's funeral, this became the starting point for the celestial sculpture after David Burma and his colleague, Phil Wyatt, held workshops with the children to begin the design process.

The brief for the second project on the Camel Trail was to take an imaginative approach on the provision of resting places along the route.

This included picnic furniture, cycle racks and visitor information.
